- 2. How will knowing the overall story (the "edge pieces of the puzzle") make a difference in your future Bible reading?
- 3. What difference does it make to know that the Biblical texts were "Inspired" by God, but the translations and transmission of those texts was not?
- 4. Why do you think God chose to use an often-confusing collection of ancient documents to communicate His word to His people? Why not a simple Divine Bullet-Point Outline or series of timeless truth statements?
